





Fish Fry Profits to Support Church Repairs:



Father Tony, in consultation with the Pastoral and Finance Councils, has decided using the profits from the Fish Fry to fund necessary repairs and repainting of the inside of Holy Cross Church. Multiple areas within the church

require attention, and this is an important step in maintaining the beauty and integrity of our worship space.

Additionally, the four AC units in the church need to be replaced. The hope is that, after the Fish Fry, there will be enough money in the restricted funds to complete the painting and



maybe one or two of the AC unit replacements. (Estimated cost for paint/repairs \$60,000 and each AC Unit is estimated at \$10,000)





<u>Pope Francis Appoints the Most Reverend Shawn</u> McKnight as Archbishop of Kansas City in Kansas



The Holy Father, Pope Francis, announced he has named the Most Reverend Shawn McKnight, S.Th.D., as the fifth archbishop of Kansas City in Kansas. Archbishop-designate McKnight will remain as the head of the Diocese of Jefferson

City for the next seven weeks until he is installed as archbishop of Kansas City in Kansas on May 27. After his installation in Kansas, the Diocese of Jefferson City's College of Consultors will elect an administrator to lead the diocese until a new bishop of Jefferson City is installed after being chosen by the Holy Father.



2025 Lenten Regulations:

<u>Abstinence:</u> Those 14 years and over are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.

Fasting: Everyone ages 18 - 59, are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting is generally understood to mean eating only one full meal each day. Two other partial meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken; but together they should not equal another full meal. (Other recommended forms of fasting, could include limiting alcoholic drink, needless television, video games, internet use, and social entertainment.)

<u>Almsgiving</u> is the act of giving to the poor. Catholics are encouraged to support generously the charitable works of the whole Church.


<u>Prayer</u> is in order to deepen one's love for Christ, all are urged to attending daily Mass and frequenting the Sacrament of Penance / Reconciliation.

Did you know about the number "40"???

- · Lent consists of the 40 days preceding Easter.
- · 40 days of rain, at the time of the Great Flood
- · Noah sending forth the raven after 40 days
- · 40 days was the time required for embalming
- Moses spent three consecutive periods of "forty days and forty nights" on Mount Sinai: 40 days of fasting by Moses
- · Goliath challenged the Israelites for forty days before David defeated him
- The prophet Elijah had to walk 40 days and 40 nights before arriving to mount Horeb
- Spies were sent by Moses to explore the land of Canaan (promised to the children of Israel) for "forty days"
- · Nineveh would be overthrown after 40 days
- · 40 is the symbolism of the siege and exiles
- · Israelites wandering in the wilderness for 40 years
- · 40 years of peace in Israel
- · 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness being tempted by the devil.
- · Christ appears for 40 days after the Resurrection -40 days was the period from the Resurrection of Jesus to the Ascension of Jesus.






<u>Homebound:</u> If you would like to minister to the homebound by visiting them and bringing them Communion, please contact S. Karen 507-514-3226.

Cemetery/ Columbarium:

Many people feel it can be a great help to their grieving family members if the desires of the deceased were planned by him/herself before the time of death. Whether cremation or burial is chosen, consider Holy Cross as yours or your loved one's final resting place. Many people are not aware that the proper practice for cremation is to place the cremains in the columbarium or bury them in the cemetery. If members of our community have the cremains of a loved one in their home, or another place other than the cemetery, they should make arrangements to give their loved ones a place to rest in the columbarium or cemetery with the proper prayers of internment.



All volunteers and all school parents (both parents) must to be VIRTUS compliant prior to volunteering or your child starting school.

Please help us, keep our children safe. The training provides us the knowledge on how to recognize signs of abuse and what to do if we suspect abuse happening. If we ALL are certified and have the training, the likelihood of a child being harmed is greatly reduced.

KEEPING OUR PROMISE TO PROTECT





Breaking the Silence of Abuse:

As a diocese, we are committed to breaking the silence of abuse. When someone is reporting abuse, we must



acknowledge their pain and how difficult it is to talk about it. False allegations are very rare. Our initial response to someone who is

disclosing abuse for the first time must be compassionate. 
Our political discourse has become increasingly rancorous and bitter. The U.S. bishops began a campaign leading into the 2020 election to restore civility to our public and political discourse

V. We seek refuge under your protection, O Holy Mother of God.


