



Order of Christian Initiation for Adults


OCIA is a process in which the Church invites adults (18



Memorial Mass for Pope Francis:





It is with deep sorrow that we share the news of the passing of our Holy Father, **Pope Francis**. Pope Francis died on Easter Monday, April 21, 2025, at the age of 88.

Our hearts are heavy as we mourn the loss of a beloved shepherd and spiritual father. Yet even as we grieve, we give thanks for his life, leadership, and the profound witness of faith he offered to the world. Pope Francis served the Church with humility, compassion, and courage, always reminding us of the call to love, to go to the margins, and to live the Gospel with joy.

Throughout his papacy, Pope Francis encouraged us not to hide behind the walls of comfort or isolation, but to step into the unpredictable moments of life where God most often speaks. He invited us to be present to the poor and the suffering, to walk alongside one another in unity, and to engage the world with open hearts and discerning spirits.

Pope Francis modeled what it means to follow Christ in our time — with mercy, with authenticity, and with hope.

Locally, we invite all parishioners to come and pray for Pope Francis. A photo of the Holy Father is displayed in the sanctuary at Holy Cross Church, along with a space for prayer and remembrance.

There will be a Memorial Mass at Holy Cross on Wednesday, April 30th at 8:30 a.m. Rosary is at 8:10 a.m.

Additionally, the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Jefferson City will host a Memorial Mass on Friday, April 25 at 12:00 noon, and all are welcome to attend.

We also encourage you to watch the livestream of Pope Francis' **funeral Mass**, which will take place on **Saturday**, **April 26**, **2025**, **at 10:00 AM** (**Rome time**) in **St. Peter's Square**. The Diocese of Jefferson City will have the livestream available at the **Cathedral of St. Joseph**.

*** Please note: Pope Francis's funeral will be at 10:00 a.m. Rome time (April 26, 2025), which is 3:00 a.m. Central Time. You can watch the funeral live on major news networks like NBC News, CNN, CBS News and ABC. You can also stream the funeral on the Vatican's news channel on YouTube and other news outlets like The New York Times and NBC.

Let us join together in prayer for the repose of Pope Francis' soul, and for the Church he so faithfully served.

Prayer for the Holy Father:

Lord Jesus, you have called Pope Francis to yourself. Thank you for the gift of his papacy. When he was with us, he tirelessly showed the Church your constant mercy toward sinners. Grant him now your mercy and let him rest eternally with you in your Kingdom. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.


CubaKofC Membership Invite:





Preparing for a Great Marriage:

The Catholic Church teaches that marriage is a covenant, a contract and a bond between a man and a woman that forms a partnership for life. The marriage bond is a unique and exclusive relationship between husband and wife for the sanctification of the couple and for the procreation and Christ-centered nurturing of children in a family.

The family, with its foundation in marriage, is a fundamental unit of the Church. Marriage is also a basic social institution of human society. Marital love is at the service of the couple, the children, the community, and of the world. Because of its timeless importance, the Church teachers that marriage between two baptized Christians is a sacrament, a source of grace and a sign of God's love for the world.

Every sacrament needs preparation for its fruitful celebration. The Church wants to ensure that those entering the life-long commitment of marriage are adequately prepared for the riches and the responsibilities that are intrinsic to it. This is why the Diocese of Jefferson City has a policy for marriage preparation. It is not to make the couple "check the boxes" or "jump through hoops." In her efforts of remote, proximate and immediate preparation, the Church is not trying to make it more difficult to get married, but rather provide the best opportunity for equipping the couple to live a shared life of love, compassion and nurturing grace.
